Brenna's Home - UKRAINE

Our January trip to Lutsk was quite exciting, both for us and for the children. We had not seen each other for almost a year and a half. Needless to say our visit was full of lots of hugs, and expressions of love. Christmas is celebrated on January 7, and we arrived on January 3, so there was a lot of activity surrounding the celebration of Christmas. The vast majority of activity is focused on the religious significance of Christmas, with much less emphasis on presents and materialism. We provide here a pictorial synopsis of some highlights of our trip.

A Special Gift

The last week of January we were contacted by someone through our website who said they worked for a United Nations program in Vienna and frequently travelled to Ukraine. They wanted to do some humanitarian work for children in Ukraine and found us through the web. After checking this out a little further we made arrangements for Ken Velice to visit Brenna's Home and present them with a large assortment of food and grocery items. He spent half a day hanging out with the kids. Thank you, Ken. We hope to meet you and that you will come back again! (Pictured below)



Please continue to pray for Ukraine as the political situation has created significant financial strain on the economy. This also has implications, for our work there, because the currency value is only half of what it was one year ago. Additional sponsors for the children help offset these increased costs. Sponsorship is a one-year commitment to provide \$25/month (\$300) toward support of a child at Brenna's Home.

High School girls - Tigrai Province

We work with Hope Community Services in Northern Ethiopia to provide monthly support for vulnerable high school girls to complete their education. In this region of Ethiopia, many girls walk two hours or more EACH WAY to attend high school. This means they face dangers while walking in darkness, and also makes it difficult for them to complete their studies. Consequently they may drop out of school and are frequently used as wives for arranged marriages, even as young as ages 13 to 17. If this happens and they become pregnant, they face challenges with childbirth because their bodies are not fully developed. This may result in a condition known as fistula. Our focus is PREVENTION.

We have committed to sponsor 30 girls for this program and we need just four more to meet our goal! Just \$25 a month will provide a shelter and food close to school or transportation services for these girls at great risk.



Le-elti's Story

One of the high school girls we sponsor is Le-elti Haile Selassie. She is 16 years old and has five younger siblings. She was an outstanding student. Her parents are uneducated peasants. They planned to get her married at age 14. Though it is not legal, anything goes in the rural areas. When the teachers came to know about the arranged marriage for a minor, they tried to persuade her parents to change their wedding plans, but the parents were adamant. Then the teachers hid the girl with one of the female teachers and reported to the community elders to intervene. To avert a legal battle for the family, the community elders persuaded the parents to let their girl continue with her schooling. Leelti passed the 8th grade national exam with an average of 96.9 out of 100. She is now in 10th grade and is able to attend school through our sponsorship program and she does not have to walk four hours each day for school. Her case was highlighted by a director of the high school I visited in Mekelle. She ranked 2nd in her class and 2nd out of the 9th grade classes. She aspires to be an engineer. These poor girls face many challenges and your help will go a long way to brighten their future.

College girls - Tigrai Province

Another opportunity also developed with Hope Community Services. Many girls graduating from high school who are orphans or from very poor families are excellent students and qualify for free tuition, room and board through a government program. However, the costs for travel and monthly hygiene expenses can be prohibitive for them to take advantage of the education. The cost for sending one of these girls to college is \$20/month (\$240/year). We will sponsor 30 girls for this program and need just ten more to reach our goal!

Hope House - Central Ethiopia

Our third project in Ethiopia continues to develop. In conjunction with Ellilta Women at Risk and Mekane Yesus Church in Debre Zeit, we have committed to provide the educational and daycare support for children whose mothers have entered Hope House, a holistic rehabilitation program to leave "working the streets". This organization has been functioning effectively in Addis Ababa for nearly 20 years, and this is a new extension of the work in the city of Debre Zeit. Our contacts are Michelle and Asaua Tiatia. Sponsorships for this program are \$30/month (we need a one year commitment). These are our "Hope House" kids. We will have more opportunities for sponsorship as women enter the program.
