Shoebox Project for Vinnytsia, UKRAINE



The children's shoeboxes sent to the Kukushkin Family are being distributed last week and this week and we will have a report and pictures in our next newsletter. Our hearts were saddened to hear of the passing of Mama Kukushkin in early December. We know their Christmas was different this year that father and the three adult children will miss her.

It was difficult for us not be able to go to Ukraine for their Christmas this year. Ukraine officially celebrates Christmas on January 7, but there is quite a bit of interest now to make that December 25, as does the rest of Europe. This has much to do with Ukraine's desire to move toward the West and shed some of the Russian influence. We are thankful for children's sponsors and others who provide gifts for them. We shipped these boxes of presents on December 8. and they arrived two days before Christmas. The picture below shows the Brenna's Home family with the beautiful handmade stockings on the couch provided by Netherwood Church.



I was able to watch the children receive and open their gifts by Skype on Christmas Eve (Thursday afternoon in NY.) Below Yura (left) and Zhenya (right) hold up presents. It's always fun to see their smiles!



One of the activities this Christmas Season was when some of the kids at Brenna's Home along with other teens and children from Resurrection Church went to an orphanage for older children with developmental challenges. They put on a special Christmas play for the orphanage children.



New Program to Assist Children with Developmental Disabilities in Lutsk, Ukraine

In November, we committed to two new projects in Lutsk. There are a number of families with children who have developmental disabilities in close proximity of Resurrection Church. While the government provides some assistance for these families, they still suffer significant hardships. The Brenna Engle Foundation committed to provide monthly support for providing these children a hot lunch six days each week. This will be on an ongoing basis. We also provided the support for a special Christmas program for these children and their families, where each family was provided a bag of food.



Brenna's Hope - Ethiopia



High School girls - Tigray Province

We work with Hope Community Services in Northern Ethiopia to provide monthly support for vulnerable high school girls to complete their education. In this region of Ethiopia, many girls walk two hours or more EACH WAY to attend high school. This means they face dangers while walking in darkness, and also makes it difficult for them to complete their studies. Consequently they may drop out of school and are frequently used as wives for arranged marriages, even as young as ages 13 to 17. If this happens and they become pregnant, they face challenges with childbirth because their bodies are not fully developed. This may result in a condition known as [fistula](#). Our focus is PREVENTION.

We sponsor 30 girls for this program and are still seeking a few more sponsors to meet our goal! Just \$25 a month will provide a shelter and food close to school or transportation services for these girls at great risk.

These girls are responsible for carrying water to their homes before they leave for school, or again after school. Often these girls will walk together in groups for safety from those who might try to take advantage of them.

Here are some of the high school girls we sponsor:



College girls - Tigray Province

Another opportunity also developed with Hope Community Services. Many girls graduating from high school who are orphans or from very poor families are excellent students and qualify for free tuition, room and board through a government program. However, the costs for travel and monthly hygiene expenses can be prohibitive for them to take advantage of the education. The cost for sending one of these girls to college is \$20/month (\$240/year). The first year we sponsored 30 girls, studying a variety of disciplines including electrical, chemical, civil engineering, veterinary medicine, accounting, land administration, public health and midwifery. After year one, six girls had grade point averages of 3.5 and higher, and 18 had GPAs of 3.0 to 3.49! This year we are providing sponsorship for 36 girls for this program. Would you consider becoming a sponsor for one of the eight girls still needing sponsorship?

Hope House - Central Ethiopia

Our third project in Ethiopia is in conjunction with Ellilta Women at Risk and Mekane Yesus Church in Debre Zeit. Since Hope House was launched as a pilot program, there have been some significant developments. The leadership of the program decided that it would be necessary to reevaluate the program and has suspended the day to day operations. The program continues to support the women that completed the program, but will not be taking additional women into the program at this time. The Brenna Engle Foundation will continue to sponsor the seven children whose mothers entered and completed this program. We have sponsors committed to six of the children, but are still in need of one more sponsor. Sponsorship for day care and education for these children is \$30/month, with a one year commitment. Hope House was set up as a holistic rehabilitation program to help women leave "working the streets". Ellilta Women at Risk has been functioning effectively in Addis Ababa for nearly 20 years. Please pray for these women and children and for the future direction of the program.

We continue to accept quality donations of children's and adult clothing, baby equipment, toys, and small household items to provide to needy families in the area.
